

MODEL-MAKING SUGGESTIONS1

FURNITURE ITEMS in WHITE MODELS

This is part of a series of suggested modelling techniques for specific elements in your models. They produce "schematic" models with little detail as required by "WHITE MODELS"

The suggestions are a brief overview of some possibilities for techniques you may use. Of course if you already are skilful in model-making please keep on with what you already do and give some feedback, please, if you have alternative suggestions to add to this general list.

FOR WHITE MODELS (foamcore)

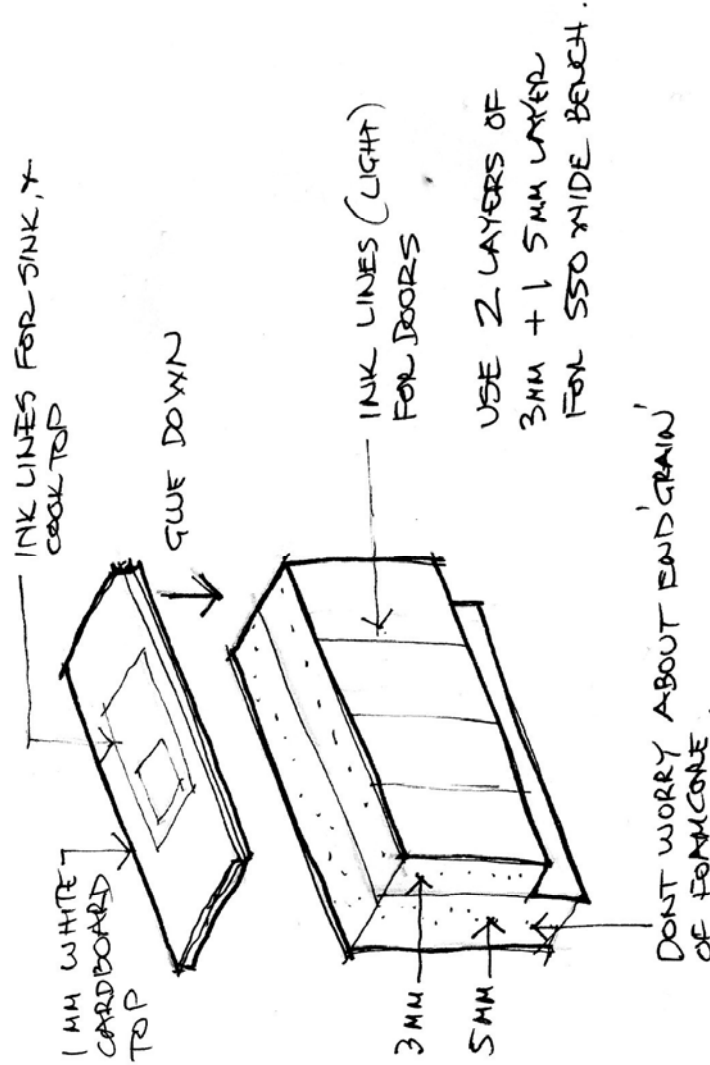
1 BENCH CUPBOARDS (suitable for 1:100 and 1:50 scale models only)

MATERIALS: 5mm and 3mm foamcore, white 1mm cardboard, very fine pen or pencil.

For approx. 460 wide bench cupboards use 1 layer of 5mm and 3mm each.

For approx. 600 wide benches use 1 layer of 5mm and 2 layers of 3mm.

Draw light lines on face of outer layer to represent doors generally. No need to be specific and doors generally are around 600 wide. Do not show handles or other trims as these ruin the "scale" and detract from the spatial model character.



No real need to apply an end skin of paper or card to these as they usually "read" OK without and you run the risk of degrading your model appearance if this skin is not applied neatly and tidily.
